

LEGACY ANZAC EXCURSION

On Friday 19 April, four of our year 7 students — Riley, Elise, Axel and Felix, accompanied by Mr. Geddes — attended the Victorian Legacy ANZAC Day schools' service to lay a wreath on behalf of the school.

After a very early start we connected in Ararat with a coach carrying students from Stawell, Ararat and Beaufort, as well as a handful of Ararat Legatees, before a run in to Melbourne to the Shrine.

Once we arrived, we quickly found seats, and after a short wait were asked to stand quietly as the catafalque party mounted guard around the cenotaph. Thousands of Victorian school students from all over the state craned their necks as an RAAF Winjeel from the RAAF museum historic flight performed a fly-past. The ceremonial guard, comprised of the Melbourne High School cadet unit, marched onto the forecourt, and the Guest of Honour, Her Excellency Professor the Honourable Margaret Gardner AC, Governor of Victoria, arrived.

The service itself was a grand, solemn and moving occasion.

LUNCHBOX IDEAS— Honey Cornflake Slice

Recipe from Bake Play Smile

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 cups cornflakes
- 1 1/3 cups rolled oats
- 1 cup desiccated coconut
- 3/4 cup caster sugar
- 150g butter
- 3 tbsp honey
- 100g white chocolate melted for decorating (optional)

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 160 degrees celsius (fan-forced). Grease and line an 18cm x 28cm baking tin with baking paper and set aside.
- Place the Cornflakes, rolled oats, desiccated coconut and caster sugar into a large bowl. Stir to combine.
- In a separate bowl (microwave-safe), place the butter and honey. Melt in the microwave on 50% power for 3 minutes or until melted.
- Pour the liquid over the dry ingredients and mix well to combine.
- Press into the prepared baking tin and bake for 20 minutes or until lightly golden.
- Allow to cool in the tin. Drizzle over the melted white chocolate (optional). Chill in the fridge for a minimum of 1 hour before cutting into pieces.
